- 4. Compare the official Soviet interpretation of health and welfare in the Soviet Union with that of one alternative theoretical model of the USSR.
- 5. How successful were the reforms of the medical system during *Perestroika*?
- 6. EITHER
 - (a) What were the causes of rising mortality rates in the Soviet period?

- (b) 'The mortality crisis in Russia in the 1990s was a social problem related to stress, rather than a medical problem related to the deterioration of the health service.' Discuss.
- 7. Assess the extent to which economic transition in Russia in the 1990s increased poverty and inequality.
- 8. Did the federal and regional governments in Russia implement effective policies to prevent the development of an HIV/AIDS epidemic during the period 1995-2004?
- 9. Evaluate the main flaws of the compulsory health insurance reform in Russia and their consequences.
- 10. Do the Russian health and welfare systems provide adequate support for women?

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
