- 1. To what extent does contemporary Polish cinema continue traditions from the Communist period? Discuss with reference to at least TWO films you have seen.
- 2. Polish prose over the last twenty years 'seeks above all to create forms with all capacity to include autobiographical ruminations and ostentatious inventiveness...' (Premyslaw Czaplinski). Discuss.
- 3. Discuss the literary use of reference to EITHER (a) Czech history OR (b) contemporary Czech society in one or two post-1945 Czech novels or essays.
- 4. Discuss the social role of an artist or a poet as portrayed in any one or two post-1968 Russian novels

- 5. Is there a difference between the narrative structure of fiction and the narrative structure of historiography?
- 6. With reference to any ONE memoir from Russia or Eastern Europe, assess the contribution made by personal testimony to our understanding of the historical record.
- 7. 'All written texts can perfectly well be described as "fictions".' Discuss this view with reference to AT LEAST TWO presumably non-fictional texts that you have studied this year.
- 8. Assess the ideological significance of EITHER (a) any one or more public monuments erected OR (b) national celebrations established in Russia or Eastern Europe after the collapse of communism.

- 9. 'Socialist Realism is not a system of literary-political controls but a creative method whereby the fundamental myths of Soviet society are celebrated and evolve'. Discuss.
- 10. 'The purpose of art, including literature, is not to reflect life, but to organize and construct it (there exists a lesser form of art for reflecting life, and that is photography)' (E. ZAMIATIN, "Our Purpose", 1926). Consider the ways in which writers of the period, including Zamiatin, fulfilled his precept.
