- 4. How important is ritual in the *Purgatorio*?
- 5. In what ways, if any, is the *Purgatorio* concerned with the world of the living?

SECTION B: Petrarch / Boccaccio

- 1. Are the characters in the stories in the *Decameron* more interesting than the narrators?
- 2. What view does Boccaccio present of human wit and intelligence in the *Decameron*?
- 3. To what extent can Petrarch's poetry be described as religious?
- 4. 'If we learn little about Laura in the course of the *Canzoniere*, we do learn a great deal about Petrarch.' Discuss.
- 5. Compare the figures of Beatrice and Laura as portrayed in the *Canzoniere* and the *Purgatorio*.
- 6. Compare the treatment of the theme of nobility in the *Purgatorio* and *Decameron*.
