Block 2: From the 17th century to the Age of Revolutions

Either:

a) What, if anything, was 'modern' about Dutch Golden Age society?

or:

b) Do you agree that the United Kingdom of the Netherlands (1814-1830) was doomed to fall apart as a nation? Justify your answer.

Block 3: The Economic and Political Geography of the Low Countries in the 19th century

Either:

a) What effects did the Industrial Revolution have on Belgium?

or:

b) Explain why the liberal democracy of Thorbecke was established in a relatively peaceful fashion.

Block 4: Divided Societies?

Either:

a) What factors contributed to the emergence and success of christian parties in the Netherlands in the nineteenth century?

or:

b) Do you agree that nineteenth-century Flemish nationalism was unlike other examples of nationalism? Justify your answer.
