Block 1: From the Late Middle Ages to the Revolt of the Netherlands, 14th-16th century

Either:

a) Consider the significance of the Burgundian period (1383-1477) for the history of the Low Countries.

or:

b) Why were the Spanish able to retain power in the Southern Netherlands but not in the North?

Block 2: From the 17th century to the Age of Revolutions

Either:

a) Do you agree that the Dutch Republic was a "haven of toleration"? Justify your answer.

or:

b) Was the United Kingdom of the Netherlands (1815–1830) doomed to fall apart as a nation from the beginning? Justify your answer.

Block 3: The Economic and Political Geography of the Low Countries in the 19th century

Either:

a) Evaluate the relatively easy transition of the Netherlands to parliamentary democracy under Thorbecke (1848).

or:

b) To what extent was Belgium ahead of the Netherlands during the 19th century in terms of political modernisation? Justify your answer.

Block 4: Divided Societies?

Either:

a) What was the most divisive political issue in 19th-century Belgium? Justify your answer.

or:

b) Did Flemish nationalism have an anti-Belgian character in the period before World War I? Justify your answer.
