- 1. Discuss the notions of idiomaticity and compositionality, as they apply to English.
- 2. Using illustrative examples, discuss the difference between lexical aspect (or aktionsart) and grammatical aspect (or viewpoint aspect).
- 3. Write an essay on the syntax and semantics of clausal negation in English.
- 4. The spoken language is, in fact, no less structured and highly organised than the written. It could not be otherwise, since both are manifestatons of the same system. (Michael Halliday)

- 5. Discuss the structure and uses of the English existential construction.
- 6. Discuss the syntactic and semantic properties of V+NP+to-infinitive constructions in English.
- 7. Discuss the syntactic differences between main clauses and subordinate clauses in English.
- 8. Using the following sentences as illustrations, write an essay on the ways in which the order of constituents can be varied within sentences, and the pragmatic factors which are relevant to such variation.

On the desk lay a large envelope. It was during the war that he made most of his money. Making money is what he does best. It's unfair to blame children for their parents' mistakes. Mistakes must be paid for.

- 9. Using the following extract from the beginning of a short story as illustration, and examples of your own if you wish, discuss some of the ways in which cohesion may be achieved in English
 - They made the usual preparations. Charlotte bought a small leg of lamb, picked purple broccoli and sprigs of mint. All were Timothy's favourites, purchased every year for April 23rd, which this year was a Thursday. Odo ensured that the gin had not gone too low: a gin and tonic,
 - **5** and then another one, was what Timothy liked. Odo did not object to that, did not in fact object to obtaining the gin specially, since it was not otherwise drunk in the house.

They were a couple in their sixties who had scarcely parted from each other in the forty-two years of their marriage. Odo was tall, thin as a straw, his bony features receding into a freckled dome on which little hair remained. - 11. Write an essay on the relationship between mood and modality in English.
- 12. Numerous kinds [of Adjuncts/Adverbials] are commonly distinguished, though in some cases the distinctions are more semantic than strictly syntactic. (Rodney Huddleston)
