- 3. Analyse the cinematic exploitation of the 'fourth look' (the character's look into the camera) in work by TWO or MORE filmmakers you have studied for this course.
- 4. Discuss the ways sound is used in relation to dialogue AND/OR voice-overs in work by TWO or MORE filmmakers you have studied for this course.
- 5. Classic Hollywood cinema exploits narrative formulas in which 'the good' end happily and 'the bad' unhappily. Discuss, with reference to work by TWO or MORE filmmakers you have studied for this course, how these formulas have been reworked in French cinema.

- 7. Discuss the contribution made by stars AND/OR the star system to an understanding of film, with reference to TWO or MORE films you have studied for this course.
- 8. Discuss the importance of notions of novelty and innovation for an understanding of French film history, with reference to work by TWO or MORE filmmakers you have studied for this course.
