- 3. 'Le Chevalier au lion explores the tension between the underlying violence of the warrior life and the overlying gloss of chivalry and love that is supposed to give it meaning.' Discuss.
- 4. Discuss the figure of the lion in Chrétien de Troyes's Le Chevalier au lion.
- 5. Discuss the theme of war in Rabelais's Gargantua.
- 6. 'Far from being limited to the chapters that specifically address book learning, Gargantua's education and maturation process extends over the entire course of Rabelais's *Gargantua*.' Discuss.
