- 2. 'The political context in which a literary text is produced is of no consequence.' Discuss with reference to BOTH Marion de Lorme AND La Peau de chagrin.
- 3. Discuss elements of modernity in BOTH Flaubert's *Madame Bovary* AND Baudelaire's *Les Fleurs du mal*.
- 4. Analyse and discuss the uses of irony in BOTH Madame Bovary AND Les Fleurs du mal.
- 5. 'La mélancolie est un concept fondamental dans la littérature française du dixneuvième siècle.' Discuss this statement with reference to TWO or MORE of the following: Marion de Lorme; La Peau de chagrin; Madame Bovary; Les Fleurs du mal.
