- 3. Discuss the balance between pleasing and instructing in TWO or MORE of the prescribed texts.
- 4. Compare and contrast the attitudes to reason and unreason in TWO or MORE of the prescribed texts.

#### PLEASE USE A SEPARATE ANSWER BOOK FOR EACH SECTION.

- 5. 'Arnolphe is such a bully and Agnès so vulnerable that the play inspires almost as much pathos as laughter.' In the light of this statement, assess to what extent Molière has succeeded in making L'École des femmes comic.
- 6. Discuss the view that it is Néron's circumstances in Racine's *Britannicus*, rather than his own flawed nature, that turn him into a monster.
- 7. Compare and contrast the part played by love in the downfall of Molière's and Racine's comic and tragic protagonists in L'École des femmes and Britannicus.
- 8. 'Self-love is the pivot of La Rochefoucauld's *Maximes*. The entire book is just the application of the general principle to particular cases.' Discuss.
- 9. Analyse and discuss the theme of death in Lafayette's La Princesse de Clèves.
- 10. 'Both Lafayette in *La Princesse de Clèves* and La Rochefoucauld in the *Maximes* are concerned with the basic ethical problem of deception within human relations.' Discuss.
