- 1. Discuss the debates that occurred between 1789 and 1799 around the possible rights under the *Déclaration des droits de l'homme et du citoyen* of ANY THREE of the following: men without property; women; Jews; blacks.
- 2. How did the French revolutionaries of 1789-1795 use visual representation as a tool for rethinking political representation?
- * 3. Explain how the conception of human rights changed in France between 1789 and 1871.
- 4. Discuss how national identity is figured in ANY TWO songs you have studied for this course.
- 5. How far can revolution in France be considered solely a matter of class conflict? Answer with reference to ONE of the following: 1830; 1848; 1871.

SECTION B

PLEASE USE A SEPARATE ANSWER BOOK FOR EACH QUESTION.

- 6. 'Nous ne devons pas risquer que se disloque la cohésion des masses, la cohésion du Front populaire.' Explain the context and significance of this statement made in June 1936 to persuade militants to abandon the occupation of the factories and return to work.
- 7. 'The extent and significance of the Resistance and of collaboration during the war were the subject of conflict and distortion in post-war France.' In the light of this statement, discuss the Occupation and its aftermath.
- 8. 'Dans les faits eux-mêmes, dans les institutions, dans la nature des échanges et de la production, le racisme est inscrit. Puisque le colonisé est un sous-homme, la *Déclaration des droits de l'homme* ne le concerne pas.' Discuss this statement with reference to colonial Algeria.

- 9. 'The events of May 1968 were the means chosen by the youth of France to modernise society.' Discuss the validity of this statement.
- 10. 'During the periods of *cohabitation*, the President has remained a key figure in French political life.' Discuss.
- 11. Explain, with reference to specific examples, the reasons for the ongoing fragmentation of the French party system.
