- 1. Discuss the concept of morality in Staudte's Die Mörder sind unter uns.
- 2. 'Fassbinder's *Die Ehe der Maria Braun* tells us more about the time of its production the 1970s than about the immediate post-war years in West Germany.' Discuss.
- 3. 'Fassbinder's Angst essen Seele auf is a descriptive rather than a critical representation of society.' Discuss.
- 4. 'Although Schlöndorff's and von Trotta's *Die verlorene Ehre der Katharina Blum* sympathises with Katharina, her lost honour is not the film's main concern.' Discuss.
- 5. Consider the modes of visual representation of the family relationships in Sanders-Brahms's *Deutschland*, *bleiche Mutter*.
- 6. 'The camera's "angelic perception" in Wenders's *Der Himmel über Berlin* allows it to see everything, and yet this perception is severely limited.' Discuss.
- 7. Consider the use of sound in Tykwer's *Lola rennt*.
- 8. 'Hirschbiegel's *Der Untergang* combines historical accuracy with cinematic drama.' Discuss.
- 9. With reference to ANY TWO of the films studied in the course, compare the ways in which they make use of written texts OR other media.
