- 3. For the period between 1917 and 1939, discuss the accuracy of the claim that the Bolshevik Revolution was "good for the Jew and bad for the Jews."
- 4. What was the impact of Communism in the Soviet Union on religion in general, and Judaism in particular?
- 5. What were the attitudes of the Communist Party leadership towards Antisemitism in the period between 1918 and 1941?
- 6. What does the Jewish role in Soviet art and literature reveal about the process of Jewish acculturation in Eastern Europe?
- 7. Many Jews were victims of Stalin's "Great Terror" in the 1930s. Was there a Jewish angle to the Stalinist Purges?
- 8. What role did the Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee play in the Great Patriotic War?
- 9. To what extent did the Soviet leadership recognise the concept of the Holocaust of Soviet Jewry between 1941 and 1953?
- 10. Analyse the explanations that have been given for the intense Antisemitism that characterised late Stalinism.
- 11. Explain the change in Soviet attitudes towards the state of Israel in the period 1947-1953.
