- 9. Outline the extent of Italian emigration in the late nineteenth century and assess its consequences for the migrants and for Italy.
- 10. Why did Italy's political class find it so difficult to reform Italian society in the post-Risorgimento era?
- 11. 'The Ministry of Evil' (Salvemini). Assess this judgement of Giolitti's southern policies.
- 12. Why did Crispi choose to repress the Sicilian fasci rather than adopt a conciliatory policy?
- 13. In what ways did 'élite theory' represent a systematic attack on liberal and socialist thought?
- 14. To what extent were the Futurists "revolutionary"?
