- 7. 'In order to say that unicorns do not exist, there must in some sense be unicorns.' Discuss.
- 8. EITHER (a) Are proper names synonymous with definite descriptions?
 - OR (b) If the sentences 'a=a' and 'a=b' differ in cognitive value, do they differ in meaning?
- 9. Does Strawson offer a cogent argument against Russell's theory of descriptions?
- 10. Are there any contingent a priori truths?
- 11. 'Truth is a substantive but indefinable property of what we say.' Discuss.
- 12. 'It is possible to travel forward in time, but not backwards in time.' Discuss.
- 13. Is it possible to dispense with talk of possible worlds in analysing subjunctive conditionals?

14. EITHER (a) Is there any more to causation than constant conjunction?

OR (b) What sorts of things are the relata of the causal relation?

15. Is free will compatible with determinism?
