- 8. 'Connectionist models of our acquisition of the English past tense show that rules are dispensable in accounting for our linguistic competence.' Discuss.
- 9. What role, if any, does intentional content play in computational accounts of cognition?
- 10. Is Chomsky right to claim that linguistic theory is about the internal structure of speakers' minds?
- 11. EITHER (a) What reasons, if any, do we have for believing that there are innate concepts?
 - OR (b) 'The concept of innateness is fundamentally confused.' Discuss.
