- Why does Frege reject the definition of numerical identity in terms of one-toone correspondence in *The Foundations of Arithmetic*? Is his reasoning sound? Was he right to do so?
- 2. Did Frege succeed in eliminating every alternative to the view that numbers are objects?
- 3. Frege acknowledges that the sense of a proper name varies from speaker to speaker. Discuss the consequences of this observation for Frege's philosophy.
- 4. Assess Frege's thesis that when words occur in indirect speech they do not have the same reference as when they occur in direct speech.
- 5. Assess Frege's case for a distinction between sense and reference.
- 6. Has a Fregean thought a unique structure?
- 7. Frege changed his mind on the question of whether a concept must determine a value for every argument. Discuss why he changed his mind and whether it was a change for the better.

8. Why does Frege maintain against Kant that analytic judgements can extend knowledge?

- 9. Assess Frege's reasons for rejecting psychologism.
- 10. Why does Frege take the reference of a sentence to be a truth value? Is this consistent with his claim that it adds nothing to a thought to say that it is true?
- How does Frege distinguish between the force of an utterance and its content? Discuss the importance of this distinction for Frege.
- 12. Does Frege's way of distinguishing concepts from objects lead to incoherence?
- 13. Assess Frege's response to the Kantian dictum that only through the medium of sensibility are objects given to us.
