- 1. Analyse Adam Oehlenschläger's poem 'Guldhornene', with special emphasis on the features that are typical of Danish Romanticism.
- 2. Examine the role that the setting plays for the mood and the events in Steen Steensen Blicher's *Hosekræmmeren*.
- 3. Consider the importance of the environment for the development of the personality, as expressed in Hans Christian Andersen's *Den grimme Ælling* and Henrik Pontoppidan's *Orneflugt*.
- 4. Discuss the meaning of the title of J.P. Jacobsen's *To Verdener*, and give examples of how the author establishes the difference between the two worlds.
- 5. Explain the symbolic meaning(s) of the journey and of the smoke in Sophus Claussen's poem 'Røg'.
- 6. Examine the modernistic features of Johannes V. Jensen's poem 'Interferens'. How far is the poem characteristic of the time when it was written?
- 7. What does 'melodien' represent in Kjeld Abell's *Melodien der blev væk*, and how valuable is it to the various characters of the play?
- 8. Assess the importance to Katrine of the birds in H.C. Branner's *De blaa Undulater*, and explain her behaviour towards them.
- 9. Discuss the meaning of the title of Leif Panduro's *Et godt liv*, with special reference to Daniel.
- 10. Consider the significance of the first sentence ('Det kunne være hvorsomhelst') of Claus Beck-Nielsen's *Tilfældet* for the theme(s) and the style of this short story.
