- 1. Give some account of the Norse discovery of America with reference to the written sources you have read.
- 2. Describe the manner in which the Vikings conducted warfare by land and by sea.
- 3. Consider the status of the poem *Hávamál* as a source for the Viking Age and review the information it can give us as such.
- 4. EITHER: (a) Assess the value of Snorri Sturluson's *Edda* as a source for myths.
  - OR: (b) Discuss the figure of Loki in Norse mythology.
- 5. EITHER: (a) What can be learnt from the verses called *Vikingarvisur* about the early career of Óláfr inn helgi Haraldsson?
  - OR: (b) What advantages and what disadvantages does skaldic poetry have as a source for the history of the Viking Age?
- 6. 'Heimskringla can only be used as a source for Viking-Age conditions with the utmost circumspection.' How far can you agree with this statement?
- 7. EITHER: (a) Assess the evidence of runic inscriptions for Viking activity eastwards.
  - OR: (b) What can be learnt from runic inscriptions about the spread of Christianity in Sweden?
  - OR: (c) What value is *Yngvars saga viðforla* to the student of the Viking Age?
- 8. Write notes on THREE of the following: walrus-ivory; the god Perun; assembly-places in Iceland; Sleipnir; the poem *Rigspula*; the position of illegitimate children in early Scandinavian society; the Bayeux tapestry; Haraldr harðráði Sigurðsson; the Skuldelev ships; Vestribyggð in Greenland; the rune-stone on Frösön (Jämtland); Kaupang (Vestfold).
