- 1. Consider the position of slaves in Viking-Age Scandinavia.
- 2. EITHER: (a) Discuss the god Thor and his place in the Norse pantheon.
 - OR: (b) What do we learn about the god Óðinn from the poem Hávamál?
- 3. What can *Eiríks saga rauða* and *Grænlendinga saga* tell us about Norse activity in America?
- 4. EITHER: (a) What can be learnt from the so-called *Vikingarvisur* about the early career of Óláfr helgi Haraldsson?
 - OR: (b) Give a critical overview of the life and poetry of Sighvatr bórðarson.
- 5. Assess the importance of Ari Þorgilsson's *Íslendingabók* as a source for the conversion of Iceland.
- 6. EITHER: (a) What can be learnt from Swedish and Icelandic sources about Ingvar's expedition to the east?
 - OR: (b) What picture do Swedish runic inscriptions give of life in the homeland in the Viking Age?
- 'We cannot dismiss them as sources for the history of Norway in the ninth and early tenth centuries.' Consider this view of Snorri's Haralds saga hárfagra and Hákonar saga góða.
- 8. Give a critical account of the main sources for Norse mythology.
- 9. Write notes on THREE of the following: the Norse in Ireland; the goddess Freyja; Fagrskinna; the cult of St Óláfr in the British Isles; the Battle of Hafrsfjorden; Sleipnir; Norse skates; Viking-Age Lejre; St Ansgar; the picture on the carved stone from Hunnestad, Skåne; ármaðr; Knut the Great.
