1. **EITHER** (a) Examine the notion of ‘escapism’ in any poet or poets studied.  
**OR** (b) ‘*Modernismo* defines modernity as anxiety.’ Discuss.
2. **EITHER** (a) Examine the ways *Modernista* poets evoke nature.  
**OR** (b) ‘*Modernista* poets sought refuge in an ideal France.’ Discuss.
3. What does Gutiérrez Nájera’s poem “La Duquesa Job” tell us about Mexico?
4. Examine Julián del Casal’s poetry as a critique of Cuba.
5. **EITHER** (a) Examine the ways Darío’s poetry sought to shock.  
**OR** (b) ‘In Darío’s poetry the great and sole theme is sensual love.’ Discuss.
6. **EITHER** (a) ‘Antonio Machado is a reticent love poet.’ Discuss.  
**OR** (b) To what degree do you think that Machado’s poetry is patriotic?
7. What does Juan Ramón Jiménez mean when he claimed that he wanted to become a poem?
8. Why do you think Ramón Gómez de la Serna is modern?
9. ‘Huidobro tried too hard to be original.’ Discuss.
10. ‘Girondo’s poems capture the frenzy of a modern city.’ Discuss.
11. **EITHER** (a) Evaluate Federico García Lorca’s fascination with pain and violence.  
**OR** (b) What do you think Lorca means by ‘gitano’?
12. **EITHER** (a) Discuss the implications of Pablo Neruda’s title *Residencia en la tierra*.  
**OR** (b) ‘Neruda’s poetry is typically avant-garde and sets out to disturb and confuse its reader.’ Discuss.
