#### SPANISH 111B: Heroes and Villains: An Introduction to Spanish American Literature and Film

Candidates should not base their answers on any texts used extensively in their course-work essays.

- 1. EITHER (a) Simón Bolívar is 'the 26<sup>th</sup> most famous person in human history'. What did he do to achieve this fame? Did he commit tactical errors?
  - OR (b) 'No somos indios ni europeos, sino una especie media entre los legítimos propietarios del país y los usurpadores españoles' (BOLÍVAR). Discuss *Carta de Jamaica* in the light of this comment.
  - OR (c) 'Bolívar, as portrayed in nineteenth- and twentieth-century paintings, is nothing short of a chameleon.' Discuss.
- 2. '—Socorro, que me han asesinado gritó don Francisco (...)
  Mientes, trompeta dijo Moreira --, te he muerto en buena ley, y ahí quedan los testigos.' (E. Gutiérrez, *Juan Moreira*)
  In the light of this passage, analyse the gaucho's attitude towards the law as portrayed in *Juan Moreira*.
- 3. 'Gabriel García Márquez's *Crónica de una muerte amunciada* turns the conventions of the detective novel inside out.' Discuss.
- 4. 'The only important theme in Isabel Allende's short stories is illicit sexuality.' Discuss with reference to her *Cuentos de Eva Luna*.
