- 1. 'In La familia de Pascual Duarte Cela exposes the intractable roots of alienation.' To what extent do you agree with this observation?
- 2. 'In *Viaje a la Alcarria* the traveller is more interested in people than places.' Discuss.
- 3. Cela has described *La colmena* as 'un pálido reflejo ... de la cotidiana, áspera, entrañable y dolorosa realidad'. Discuss the novel in the light of this observation.
- 4. D.W. McPheeters suggests that the title of Cela's third travel book, *Judios, moros y cristianos*, 'is a little misleading'. Does this title accurately reflect the themes of the work?
- 'Mazurca para dos muertos is a striking blend of history, fantasy, and myth.'
 Discuss.
- 6. 'Se transparenta en Cela una tendencia a la literaturización de toda experiencia.'
 Discuss with reference to AT LEAST ONE of Cela's novels or travel books.
- 7. 'Parody and exaggeration are the hallmarks of Cela's fiction.' Discuss with reference to AT LEAST ONE of the author's novels.
- 8. 'In his travel works and in his novels, Cela tends to string together episodes and situations which often leads to a rather disjointed narrative effect.' Discuss, with reference to AT LEAST ONE of his novels or travel accounts, the extent to which you agree with this assessment.
