### SPANISH S525A Women's Writing in Latin America

#### Candidates should answer THREE questions

Essays may be written in either Spanish or English, but no extra credit will be given for answers in Spanish.

Candidates should not base more than ONE answer on a particular work.

Candidates should not base their answers on any text or texts-used extensively in their course-work essay.

- 1. 'Sor Juana's *Respuesta* combines theological debate with autobiography and proto-feminist critique in a way which is not always convincing.' Discuss.
- 2. 'Sab operates more effectively as an allegory of the need for women's rights in Spain and her colonies than as an anti-slavery document.' How far do you agree with this statement?
- 'Rosario Castellanos uses everyday situations in her short stories in order to portray the inescapability of women's oppression within patriarchal society.' Discuss.
- 4. 'Las memorias de Mamá Blanca portrays reality as a mess created by men since Independence, a space in which women can have no place.' Discuss.
- 5. 'Hasta no verte Jesus mío is more fiction than fact.' Discuss.
- 6. 'In *Papeles de Pandora* women are satirised for being decorative and "doll-like", but the trouble is that there are no positive images of women in the stories.' Discuss.
- 7. 'In Luisa Valenzuela's short stories, sexual oppression and political oppression collude in unexpected, unnerving ways.' Discuss this evaluation of *Cambio de armas*.
- 8. 'In Ana Lydia Vega's fiction the deconstruction of novelistic conventions is not simply an artistic innovation; it allegorises the way in which patriarchal systems are hollowed out from within.' Discuss.
- 9. 'One is not born, one becomes a woman' (Simone de Beauvoir). Evaluate ANY ONE literary work studied in this course in the light of this assertion.
- 10. 'Feminist theory seeks to uncover the sinister workings of patriarchal society.' Assess the validity of this observation with reference to ANY ONE literary work studied in this course.
