- 4. Do you agree that policy-makers only favour targeted interventions because they are less expensive than universal interventions?
- 5. Do NGOs help the poor to access the resources they need to improve their lives, or do NGOs hinder developmental progress by failing to adequately represent the poor?
- 6. If poverty is a consequence of globalisation, does this render grass-roots social movements defunct?
- 7. Identify two different approaches to poverty reduction. To what extent are these mutually incompatible, or complementary?
- 8. The culture of the non-poor keeps the poor in poverty. Discuss.
