- Q7. What types of planning interventions, programmes and projects contribute to the practical implementation of any one principle of cosmopolitan development?
- Q8. What methods and techniques are required for a process of 'cosmopolitan development planning'?
- Q9. How does the concept of cosmopolitan development planning extend the conventional 'agenda' of urban policy, planning and management?
- Q10. Using a city of your choice, illustrate any existing programmes or institutions which you can identify as potential contributors to promoting cultural development and intercultural co-existence.
