4. Discuss the significance of the land and of food production for the issue of sustainable development.
5. "If the South could move directly to a more technologically advanced stage of development, the problem of sustainability could be reconciled with that of narrowing the North-South divide". Discuss.
6. In what ways have corporate and business interests reacted to the environmental challenge, and are such responses part of the problem or of the solution?
7. What are the implications for the sustainability problematic of the relationship between poverty and growth?
8. What new challenges have been posed for sustainability by the changes in the global political economy over the past two decades?
9. "Even if I would be paid to participate, I will not go [to Johannesburg], because I do not want to be part of another scam just fooling the world - Rio was enough." (Tsuma Hamisi, Kenya). What accounts for the disillusionment expressed by many grassroots activists about the Johannesburg summit, and how justified was it?
10. What social issues need to be addressed in envisaging a future sustainable scenario and the transition to it?
