Answer FOUR questions.

- 1. Critically examine the new regime for nature conservation under the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000.
- 2. Climate change is a novel problem that has led to the application of novel regulatory strategies, for example the use of voluntary agreements, being applied. Give your assessment of the appropriateness of such strategies,.
- 3. Assessments of the environmental effects of development are now commonplace in the development consent system. What impact has environmental assessment had on the balance between environmental protection and development?
- 4. To what extent has the United Kingdom's Integrated Pollution Control regime been strengthened by the Directive 96/61 on Integrated Pollution Prevention and Control? Assess what further developments could usefully be made in the prevention and control of pollution.
- 5. Critically analyse the influence of the human rights agenda on planning and environmental law and practice in the United Kingdom.
- 6. Critically analyse the current administrative arrangements and structures for environmental policy in the United Kingdom. How would you alter these arrangements to further environmental protection?
- 7. Consider the extent to which international law has influenced the content and direction of United Kingdom environmental law. Use examples from at least **ONE** area of law to illustrate your answer.
- 8. What is the current state of the sustainable development agenda in environmental law and policy in the United Kingdom? Explore its likely future development.
- 9. Critically analyse the imposition of criminal sanctions from an environmental protection perspective.
