- 1. Choose one of the Fundamental Principles of the Red Cross. Discuss, with reference to examples, whether it has driven or limited humanitarian intervention
- 2. "Rape is a weapon of war". Using specific examples, explain the steps taken by the international community to address this problem.
- 3. Discuss the need for and prospects of UN reform.
- 4. What are the most important public health needs in situations of mass displacement and how are responses implemented?
- 5. How does the promotion of Human Rights in situations of armed conflict highlight many of the divergences between the human rights and humanitarian communities?
- 6. Without addressing the global issues of violence and conflict, the Millennium Development Goals will not be achievable. Discuss with reference to specific examples
- 7. "The international community failed in its attempts to prevent and mediate in a number of conflicts during the 1990s". Discuss with examples from one or more of these conflicts.
- 8. What impact has the notion of 'Human Security' had on the discourse about refugees and internally displaced people?
- 9. "Soldiers, Wives, Cooks and Spies". How accurately does this describe women's roles in situations of armed conflict? Illustrate your argument with examples.
- 10. "Post-conflict and post-disaster relief should include immediate aid for the body and mind at the same time." Critically assess this statement with reference to one or two relevant examples.
