5. What contributions might physicians employed in places of detention make to the enforcement of human rights norms within such places?
6. In what ways might the death penalty violate human rights?
7. Discuss the outlawing of rape by EITHER  
international criminal tribunals  
OR  
regional human rights courts  
during the last decade.
8. What could a doctor tell a torture survivor about the international protection standards available to prevent asylum seekers being returned to the country where they were tortured?
9. 'The combined approach of the UN Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, the UN Special Rapporteur on the Right to Health and the World Health Organization, offer a powerful opportunity for the realisation of the right to health.'  
What evidence is there to support this?
10. Human rights groups advance their cause through publicity, legal precedents and generating new procedures. Give an example of the effective use of any ONE of these in an area of interest to health professionals.
