- 6. Discuss how you might examine the stresses associated with migration in any one ethnic group.

- 1. How universal is the notion of the Oedipus Complex? What conclusions can we draw now from the Jones-Malinowski debate?
- 2. How might the pharmacology of ANY ONE psychoactive substance by utilised by ANY ONE society?

- 3. Give a critical account of ANY ONE culture-bound syndrome (whether Western or non-Western)
- 4. Assess the claim that "health is a luxury that only the rich can afford: 'health for all' is as unobtainable as the elimination of poverty".
- 5. How have anthropologists explained the approved power of witchcraft and sorcery to kill?
- 6. Outline the different ways by which we might examine and categorise local concepts of illness.
