1. Your organisation has discovered that PC hardware and software is being purchased in small quantities by individual groups and by departments.
 - a) Discuss the impact this random purchasing might have on the organisation. **(15 marks)**
 - b) Detail the actions you would take to address any problems arising from this style of purchasing. **(10 marks)**

2. Produce a report which briefly discusses the issues which should be considered when developing a security policy for the management of computer based information systems.

State any assumptions you make with reference to the size and type of organisation. **(25 marks)**

3. The computer centre of a business organisation for which you work contains a number of servers connected to local and remote PC users. The computer centre is relocating to an existing office building on another site. The IT platform consists of a PC network connected to servers.

You are asked to provide a set of guidelines detailing the issues to be considered in preparation for the relocation. **(25 marks)**

 - a) Briefly describe the information needs of a business organisation of your choice, indicating why the information is required. **(15 marks)**
 - b) Discuss the reasons why different people in an organisation require different information. **(10 marks)**

5. The Managing Director was heard to remark: “Why should we have the Head of Information Systems on the Board? It is a service department, just like the catering unit...”

Discuss the issues you would use to demonstrate, to the MD, the strategic importance of Information Systems to a business organisation. **(25 marks)**

6. It is essential that proper controls exist over the design and implementation of any Information System project. An incorrectly designed system can lead to intangible costs which cannot be easily quantified.
 - a) Describe the role of an Information System Steering Committee. **(15 marks)**
 - b) Explain any intangible costs, which may arise from the implementation of an incorrectly designed system. **(10 marks)**
