NGĀ TOHUTOHU

TŪMAHI TUATAHI: Tuhinga Roa

Tuhia he kōrero, 200–250 kupu (1–1½ whārangi) te roa, mō TĒTAHI o ēnei kaupapa e whai ake nei. Write a passage of 200–250 words (1–1½ pages) in length on ONE of the following topics.

- (1) Ānei te tīmatanga o tētahi pakiwaitara whakaihihi – māu anō e whakaoti:
Here is the beginning of an interesting story – which you must complete in Māori:

I TE NGAHERE

‘Me whakaatu ahau i tētahi āhua tino rerekē i ahau e ngaro ana ki roto i te ngahere. He roa te wā i hīkoi noa iho, e rapu haere ana i te huarahi. Anā ka pōuri te rangi o te ahiahi i te kapua marangai. Ka tīmata te ua ki te heke, ka taimaha hoki ko tōku ngākau. Ka pau tōku kaha katoa ki te piki ake i tētahi puke ki reira, ā, ka tae ki te tihi, ki tētahi wāhi wātea. Kātahi ahau ka kite i tētahi tangata pākeke e noho iho ana ki runga i te whenua ki tua. Kāhore ia e aro mai ana ki ahau, ēngari ko te āhua o tōna kākahu, he korowai kiwikiwi pea, kāhore e tino mārāma ana te kite atu ...’

‘The strangest thing happened to me when I got lost on a bush walk. I wandered around for what seemed like hours looking for the track, as a gathering storm quickly darkened the late afternoon sky. As the rain started to fall so did my spirits. I walked up a nearby hill as quickly as I could, until I reached a clearing at the top. Suddenly I realised there was an old person on the other side of the clearing, seated on the ground, facing away from me. The old person was wearing what looked like a grey cloak, though it was difficult to see clearly ...’

- (2) **Tangata Rongonui**

He rīpoata tēnei, e rite ana kia whakauru ki roto ki tētahi niupepa, pukapuka kura rānei. Me tuhi mō tētahi tangata rongonui nō te ao Māori rānei, nō te ao whānui rānei. Whakarāpopotohia tōna ao, e whakamārāma ana i ngā āhuatanga o tōna iwi, whānau, kāinga, mahi, me ērā atu.

Whakamāramatia hoki ngā take e mōhiotia whānuitia ana tēnei tangata, me ōu ake whakaaro hoki mōna. He aha ngā akoranga kei roto i te oranga o tēnei tangata mō te taitamariki, ā, mō te iwi katoa?

This is a report suitable for inclusion in a magazine or school text. Write about a famous person from either the Māori world or the wider world. Give a summary of his or her life, explaining the circumstances of their background, family, home, occupation or famous deeds, and so on. Explain the reasons why this person is well known, and give your personal opinion of them. What lessons can be drawn from the life of this person for young people, or for everyone?

- (3) **Me Whakaheke Iho te Tau Wehe i te Kura**

He tuhinga taupatupatu tēnei, mehemea ka whakaae rānei, ka whakahē rānei koe ki te kaupapa nei, me whakaheke iho te tau e āhei ana te taitamariki ki te wehe i te kura ki te tekau mā rima tau. Me āta whakamārāma koe i ōu ake whakaaro, i ngā take e whakaae ana rānei, e whakahē ana rānei koe ki tēnei kaupapa, me ngā tauira whānui hei tautoko i ōu whakaaro.

This essay presents your arguments either for or against the suggestion that the school-leaving age be lowered to 15, as if you were preparing for a debate. Your answer should fully explain your ideas, and the reasons why you would argue either for or against this suggestion, using examples and wider observations to illustrate your points.
