QUESTION ONE

You will hear an extract of the song Let Me Be There as performed by Olivia Newton-John.

Refer to **Extract 1** in the Answer Booklet and answer by writing on the score extract.

You will hear the extract EIGHT times, as stated in the table below. There will be a gap of one minute between playings.

During these playings complete as many of Questions (a)–(e) as you can.

1. whole extract	5. whole extract again
2. bars 1–20: complete (a), (b) and (c)	6. whole extract (third time)
3. bars 1–20 again: complete (a), (b) and (c)	7. bars 21–37: complete (d) and (e)
4. bars 1–20 again: complete (a), (b) and (c)	8. bars 21–37 again: complete (d) and (e)

This will be followed by five minutes of silence to enable you to continue to complete your answers. You will then hear the WHOLE extract TWICE more with a gap of two minutes between playings.

- (a) Add a suitable **tempo indication** to the song to match the performance you hear. Use an English on Italian term on add a metronome marking.
- Identify the **chords** numbered (1-5) by writing chord indications, using jazz/rock notation, (b) eg \overline{Cm} , above the vocal line in the boxes given.
- Complete the pitch and rhythm of the vocal phrases at: (C)
 - bar 7 to the first beat of bar 9; (i)
 - bars 11-12; (ii)
 - (iii) bars 19-20.

The missing vocal phrases are highlighted on the score.

- Identify the **chords** numbered 6-7 by writing chord indications, using jazz/rock notation, (d) eg Cm, above the vocal line in the boxes given.
- Complete the **pitch and rhythm** of the bass voice from the third beat of bar 33 to the first (e) beat of bar 37.

These bars are highlighted on the score.

QUESTION TWO

You will hear bars 1–35 of a movement from Trio No 2 in E flat major, Op. 100 by Schubert.

Refer to **Extract 2** in the Answer Booklet and answer by writing on the score extract.

You will hear the extract EIGHT times as stated in the table below. There will be a gap of one minute between playings.

During these playings, complete as many of Questions (a)–(e) as you can.

1. whole extract	5. whole extract again
2. bars 1–19: complete (a), (b) and (c)	6. bars 19–35: complete (d) and (e)
3. bars 1–19 again: complete (a), (b) and (c)	7. bars 19–35 again: complete (d) and (e)
4. bars 1–19 again: complete (a), (b) and (c)	8. bars 19–35 again: complete (d) and (e)

This will be followed by five minutes of silence to enable you to continue to complete your answers. You will then hear the WHOLE extract TWICE more with a gap of two minutes between playings.

- (a) Add a **tempo indication** to this music above the first bar to match the performance you hear. Use an Italian *on* English term *on* add a metronome marking.
- (b) Identify the chords numbered ①–⑥ by writing chord indications, using Roman numeral notation, on the Piano stave in the boxes given, eg Ⅳ. Identify inversions where appropriate. All chords must be analysed within the key of C minor.
- (c) Complete the **pitch and rhythm** of the Cello part from the beginning of bar 7 to the end of bar 14. The missing part is highlighted on the score.
- (d) Complete the **pitch and rhythm** of the Violin part from the beginning of bar 26 to the first quaver beat of bar 29.
 The missing part is highlighted on the score.
- (e) Add **dynamics** and **articulation** (slurs, accents and staccato markings) to the Violin part from bars 26–35, to match the performance you hear.
